In science they have begun to look at habitats and are using lots of the information they learnt from their Rainham Marshes trip to help them.

The children worked so hard, and persevered throughout the sweltering heat, to deliver a sensational performance full of songs, puppetry and acting! The children really enjoyed the opportunity to work alongside professional jazz singers and a crew of theatre directors to deliver their moving performance.
