How has transport in Camden changed over time?

As a **Rights Respecting School** we are learning about the rights and lives of children all over the world and through our curriculum we will, explore the Year 1 Big Question, **‘Where does our food come from?’**

This final term sees the conclusion of this academic year’s project **‘Shaping Our Future – Let no one be left behind’**, during which we have learnt about the new Sustainable Development Goals and their relevance to the children’s future. We continue to raise awareness about the Global Goals in this term’s theme **Planet 50:50**. The children will reflect on the role of gender in the efforts to make our world a better place for everyone; in shaping our future girls and women must not be left behind.

Humanities

As part of the whole school focus on gender inequality we will be learning about the ‘Land Girl’ movement of the Second World War. We will also be looking at how food is traded fairly across the world. We will be using maps to find out about which countries different foods are grown.

In addition to this, we will be learning about Harriet Tubman who was an escaped slave who dedicated her life to freeing others.

English

Through our key texts Farmer Duck by Martin Waddell we will be exploring story writing. We will learn about poetry using Lila and the secret of the rain by David Conway and Cloudbusting by Mallory Blackman. We will be exploring the themes of friendship and kindness.

We will be using our punctuation and phonics skills to write about the life of Harriet Tubman.

Maths

This term we will begin by looking at fractions and using the associated vocabulary part and whole. We will revisit our number bond facts within 20.

We will continue to explore addition and subtraction, multiplication and division through games and practical activities. We are learning that good mathematicians keep on trying.

Science

We will be learning about materials this term and will identify and name wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock. We will group together a variety of everyday materials based on their properties. We will learn how to tell the difference between an object and the material it is made from. We will have a science materials workshop in school on Tuesday 12th February



PE

We will be learning about sports played in the Olympics and we will hold our very own mini Olympics.

This term we will have our whole school sports day and details will be sent out shortly so you can come and cheer us on.

RE

This term the children will be sharing books that are special to them and learning about books that are special to different religions. This term our focus is Judaism.

Computing

We will create and debug simple programmes.

We will learn what algorithms are.

PSHE

We are exploring the themes of freinsdhip and bullying through poetry, drama and role play. We are wrtng friendship recipes. Ask us what makes a good friend.

Art,

We will be working with our resident artist to create a 'Twelfth Night' inspired artwork. We will use lots of different artist tools and explore how to create textures.
