Easter holiday project - making a weather station

We are going to be meteorologists (scientists who measure and predict the weather). Whether it's a rain gauge to measure rainfall, a weather vane to measure the direction of the wind, or a barometer to measure air pressure, there's loads you can do! Use the attached list of links for inspiration. If you are unable to make something, then just do a detailed, labelled drawing of it.

To show us your learning we would love for you to take a picture of what you have made or designed and either upload to Google Classroom or email to admin@torriano.camden.sch.uk with 'Year 4 holiday project' and your name. You should also create a poster or page explaining how you made or designed your weather station, what maths you used and how it works. You could do this in a number of ways including:

- Explanation text with headings and subheadings like we did for World Book Day
- Comic strip
- Weather diary
- Spider diagram showing your thinking and how it links together
- Video or audio explanation
- Poster
